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ELRC supports the development of LT

- <u>CEF eTranslation:</u>
 - Neural machine translation tool provided by the European Commission (EC) to all EU bodies but also public services and public administrations across Europe
 - for 24 official languages of the EU (24 <-> 24), Chinese, Russian, Turkish, Ukrainian etc.
 - Secure & scalable
 - Facts and figures:
 - 250+ applications connected to eTranslation
 - More than 18.000 registered users end of 2021
 - More than 240 Mio. pages translated
- Additional services provided by the EC:
 - Multilingual tweets
 - Speech-to-text
 - Anonymsiation etc.


ELRC Objectives at a glance
