INTRODUCTION

The price of failure is too high.

Energy is the life blood of our society. The well-being of our people, industry and economy depends on safe, secure, sustainable and affordable energy. At the same time, energy related emissions account for almost 80% of the EU's total greenhouse gas emissions. The energy challenge is thus one of the greatest tests which Europe has to face. It will take decades to steer our energy systems onto a more secure and sustainable path. Yet the decisions to set us on the right path are needed urgently as failing to achieve a well-functioning European energy market will only increase the costs for consumers and put Europe's competitiveness at risk.

Over the next ten years, energy investments in the order of € 1 trillion are needed, both to diversify existing resources and replace equipment and to cater for challenging and changing energy requirements. Structural changes in energy supply, partly resulting from changes in indigenous production, oblige European economies to choose among energy products and infrastructures. These choices will be felt over the next 30 years and more. To enable these decisions to be taken urgently calls for an ambitious policy framework. Postponing these decisions will have immeasurable repercussions on society as regards both longer-term costs and security.

UVOD

Cena za zlyhanie je pravysoka.

Energia je životodarnou silou našej spoločnosti. Blahobyt a prosperita našej spoločnosti, priemyslu a hospodárstva závisí od bezpečnej, zabezpečenej, udržateľnej a cenovo prijateľnej energie. Emisie súvisiace s energetikou zároveň predstavujú takmer 80 % celkových emisií skleníkových plynov EÚ. Energetická výzva sa tak stáva jednou z najväčších výziev pre Európu. Potreba desaťročia, kým sa naše energetické systémy ocitnú na bezpečnejšej a udržateľnej ceste. Ale rozhodnutia, ktoré nás povedú správnym smerom, sú neodkladne potrebné, pretože ak sa nám nepodari vytvoriť dobre fungujúci európsky trh s energiou, len tým zvýšime náklady pre spotrebiteľov a vystavíme riziku európsku konkurencieschopnosť.

Počas najbližších desiatich rokov sú potrebné investície do energetiky rádomo vo výške 1 bilióna EUR, tak na diverzifikovanie existujúcich zdrojov a výmenu zariadení, ako aj na udržanie kroku s nerôznymi a meniacimi sa požiadavkami na energiu. Európske hospodárstva si musia vybrať medzi energetickými produktmi a infraštruktúrami v dôsledku štruktúrnych zmien v dodávkach energie čiastočne vyplývajúcich zo zmien v domácej produkcii. Nutnosť takéhoto výberu budeme pociťovať najbližších 30 rokov, ba aj dlhšie. Na to, aby sme mohli čo najrýchlejšie prijať takéto rozhodnutia, potrebujeme ambiciózne politický rámec. Odkladanie takýchto rozhodnutí bude mať pre spoločnosť neúmerne negatívne dôsledky, tak z hľadiska dlhodobých nákladov, ako aj bezpečnosti.

WHAT WORKS LESS WELL

- Non-standard, new or creative text
- Single words or expressions, and anything that depends on context
